

### **School Solar Panels**



The solar panels for Primary Schools scheme was expanded this year to include all schools in County Dublin. We registered our interest and have been approved to proceed with our selected contractor. The scheme covers the cost of I4 solar panels which is similar to a domestic dwelling. The BOM will discuss and examine the possibility of investing in a greater number of panels at our next meeting in January to determine if there is an opportunity to reduce our electricity costs long term and be more green!

### **ANA Review**

Throughout this Term we have been reviewing our ANA allocation to best meet the needs of all students who would benefit from additional support. At present we have 4.5 ANAs allocated to our mainstream classes and they are tasked with meeting the care needs among almost 400 children. We have continuously engaged with the NCSE and following their advice we have reviewed, reprioritised and redeployed so that children with the greatest level of care needs receive the greatest level of support. However, following this we continue to have unmet needs in our school.

To address this imbalance we have submitted an ANA review to the NCSE to highlight the level of support we can provide at present against the level of support which we believe is required to meet the needs of the greatest number of children in our school. I would like to thank all our ANAs and our entire SET team for their support and input in making this submission.

# 6th Class - Gurdwara visit by Daisy
